

COMMODORE MARTIN QUINN ADC RNR

Martin was appointed Commander of the Reserves in April 2016 and is responsible for the organisation, development and capability delivery of the Royal Naval Reserve and the Royal Marines Reserve.

Martin joined the Royal Navy in the early 1980's as a Weapons Engineer but later became a Logistics Officer. His early career saw him serving in Operation Banner and later Assistant Secretary to the Captain of the Royal Naval Engineering College, Manadon. Qualifying as a Submariner he spent a number of years as the Supply Officer in Polaris submarines.

Appointed to the staff of the Senior Naval Officer Northern Ireland 1994 he then served as a Special Projects Officer for FOSNNI based in Belfast. He subsequently became the Royal Navy's first Regional Business Manager based in Northern Ireland, and he served there until retiring at the end of his commission in 2003.

He re-joined the Royal Navy as a Reservist in the Media Operations Specialisation and undertook assignments in the UK and overseas and was deployed to Sierra Leone. In 2008 he was appointed Head of Media Operations and mobilised to Afghanistan working for Commander NATO ISAF and Coalition Forces at HQ ISAF Kabul.

Promoted Commander in 2009 he assumed command of HMS CAROLINE, Belfast's Royal Naval Reserve Unit and oversaw the historic vessel's decommissioning in 2011 and became the first Commanding Officer of HMS HIBERNIA the new RNR Unit based in Thiepval Barracks, Lisburn.

Promoted Captain in 2011 he was appointed Captain Reserve Force Generation, then in 2013 Captain (Regions) South and produced the Maritime Reserve capability requirements statement for the future Reserves 2020 study.

Seconded back to the Royal Navy full time as Deputy Commander Maritime Reserves, Martin was promoted Commodore and assumed Command of the Maritime Reserve in April 2016.

Martin is married to Maria, a civil servant, and his hobbies include travel, watching rugby and cooking.
